Our whole school attendance for the last week of term was 95.5% which unfortunately is still below our target.

Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have been learning all about bears this week. In literacy we have been using the story 'We're Going On A Bear Hunt', we drew one of the settings in the story and later in the week will be going on our own bear hunt and drawing a story map. In carpet time we have been learning about what hibernation is and which animals like to hibernate. We have had a fantastic family learning session today making some reindeer food after discovering some very hungry reindeers broke into our classroom in the hunt for some food!


Year 1 have continued with subtraction in maths; we took away a number by drawing counters and crossing them off to see how many were left. In computing children learnt how to draw the lines and fill in the boxes with prime colour paint as we are working on creating a picture in style of Piet Mondrian. We have changed our indoor PE for yoga for this half term so children started learning different poses on their mats.

Year 2 and 3 had a fantastic family learning session this morning making amazing Christmas bracelets, look out for these at the Christmas Fayre in a couple of weeks. In music, we have been using our unit of Volcanoes to compose our own volcano inspired music using a graphic score. In maths, Year 2 have been continuing their learning on 2-digit addition and subtraction using the column method and Year 3 will now be moving onto their multiplication and division unit.

Year 4 have been working really hard to complete their assessments. In english we have been looking at foodscapes and have been creating a setting description based on it. In geography we have been looking at grid references. In RE we have continued looking at symbolic things in the nativity story and have been creating our own symbols using this.

Year 5 have been composing polyrhythms inspired by African Music in music. In history they have been learning about crime and punishment in Tudor Britain and Roman Britain, comparing the two. Finally, in science they have been learning about air resistance and making paper airplanes to investigate the effects of air resistance on objects.

Year 6 have enjoyed working towards their exhibition which will take place on Wednesday 11th December at 2pm. They have been multiplying fractions in maths and innovating a biography on Katherine Johnson. This is in preparation for choosing their own iconic figure to write about next week.
