Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have been learning all about their local area this week and are looking forward to their scavenger hunt tomorrow. In drawing club they have been looking at the story 'Rosie's Walk' and have written and drawn about the characters and thought of some fantastic ideas for how the fox can trap Rosie. Today the children created a whole class map of Rosie's walk and thought of the initial sounds in the words.


Year 1 have been learning and writing lots of facts about a hedgehog in english. In maths we finished the Place Value unit and we are moving on to Addition and Subtraction within 10. In PSHE we discussed our rights and responsibilities within our class and the children drew lovely pictures based on it, most of them were about tidying up the classroom. Hope you enjoyed the paintings we sent home this week; they were created during our art session when we did printing, using lots of classroom objects.

Year 2 and 3 have been reading a new book called the Stone Age Boy. We have been practicing making predictions about the plot of the story. We will be writing a diary entry from the perspective of Om, a stone age girl. In art we have been using charcoal to create some Stone Age style pieces. We are all looking forward to Harvest Festival on Tuesday 8th. Please let us know if you can walk with us to the church and stay to watch.

Year 4 have been working really hard this week. They have continued to learn place value in maths. In english the children are adapting the story of the lighthouse to a story about a Roman slave boy. They have changed the setting to a Roman market. On Tuesday, the children had a Roman workshop to further their knowledge about the Romans. In science, the children have been looking at teeth and looked at what different drinks do to them. They are conducting an experiment with eggs, then making their own toothpaste to see how much cleaning they need.

Year 5 have finished their character description in english and have moved onto their poetry unit: looking at the poem 'Blue Extinction'. In maths they have begun their addition and subtraction unit. In science, they made a model of the solar system in order to see the distances between each planet.

Year 6 are continuing to enjoy reading The Midnight Guardians by Ross Montgomery and are currently exploring the character of The Midwinter King, in preparation to write in character. In maths, we are developing our skills when dividing using not only formal methods but our knowledge of rules of divisibility to assist us. We have enjoyed classifying unusual animals in science and will be learning about the Linnaean Classification System this week.
