
### **NOTICEBOARD**

## The Importance Of Being In School Every Day

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We have had a wonderful start to the new academic year, and in Assembly have been thinking about new starts, feeling anxiety and the power of having a 'Growth Mindset'.

It has also been a very positive start with regards to attendance and punctuality. Regular school attendance is an extremely important part of giving children the best possible start in life. Equally important is that all children arrive on time. Registers are completed at 8.50am and children arriving after this time are recorded as late and will need to be signed in by their parent at the office.

If your child arrives at school later than 9.20am we are required to mark them as absent for that half day session and it is classed as an unauthorised absence. If a child is regularly late for school, a parent will be expected to attend a meeting to look at how punctuality can be improved.

Learning begins promptly at the start of the day and children miss vital learning if they are late to school. 10 minutes late each day equates to 6 days learning lost a year. 30 minutes late each equates to 18 days lost a year. Please try to ensure your child arrives at school on time each day.

Starting on 19th August 2024, there are several changes to penalty notices for school absences. These are:

- There will be a new national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for when a penalty notice must be considered.
- The new rules mean parents will no longer be able to take their child out of school for one week's holiday without a penalty notice being issued.
- There will be an increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the
  fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being
  issued
- If a second penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.
- If a parent then commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will need to consider other enforcement options available to them.

#### Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage: Butterflies have settled into school really well. The children have been learning all about their families this week and have done an excellent job at learning the song Humpty Dumpty. They have also been using a range of materials to make paper plate faces of themselves. Their favourite things to play with have been the outdoor area and the home corner. Well done on a fantastic first week of school Butterflies!

Year 1: The children have settled really well into Year 1 and they are getting more familiar with routine in KS1. In english we have been learning about our class animal, the Robin. The children have labelled parts of robins and wrote some fact files about them. In maths we have been counting and representing objects within a group of 10. We had fun practising the ball skills in our first PE lesson.

Year 2 & 3: The children have had a lovely start to their Stone Age learning by creating some Stone Age inspired art using natural pigments like turmeric, beetroot and berries. They have been researching and showing off their writing skills by writing fact files about woolly mammoths. They have also begun to learn some catchy Stone Age songs!

Year 4: We are extremely proud of how well Year 4 have settled into the new school year. The children have hit the ground running in all subjects and they have really embraced this challenge. The children had their first swimming session yesterday and they did themselves and the school proud. Look out for some information about a 'meet the teacher' session coming up very soon. This session will introduce us to you as well as give information about events throughout the academic year in Year 4.

Year 5 have had a great first week! They have been learning about roman numerals to 1000 in maths and have been developing their knowledge of grammar in english. In art, they have begun their topic on retro-futurism, building their skills of mixing paints to create shades. Finally, in reading they have started their novel for the term: 'Holes'.


