I will come into school through the double doors. If I have a lunchbox, I will put it on the trolley first.



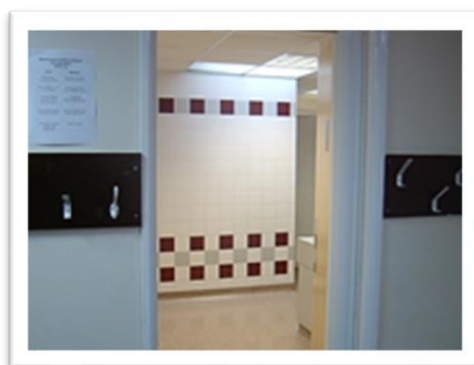
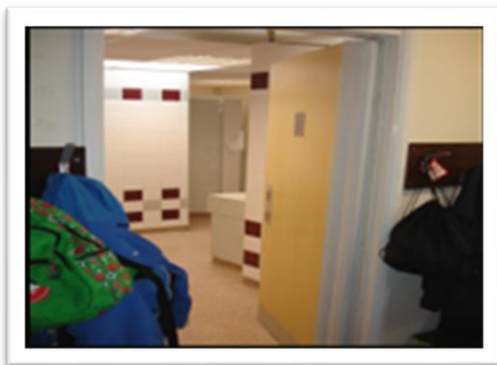
This is my new cloakroom. I will put my coat and PE bag on my peg.
