Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have settled into school life really well and are already making some firm friendships. They have enjoyed painting self portraits and exploring what makes them unique. During maths sessions they have been learning new counting songs to 10 and have been introduced to a ten frame. During phonics they have learnt the sounds m, a, s, d, t.

Year 1 have settled really well into their new classes. This week they have drawn and labelled their houses and written about their favourite rooms. The children drew maps of their journeys to school and the things they see on the way. In maths they have been sorting and counting groups of objects.

Year 2 have settled back into school really well. The children have started their topic of "The Great Fire of London" and are really enjoying learning lots of facts. In English they have sequenced the events and are practising their sentence writing. In maths they have started their unit on Place Value; partitioning numbers into tens and ones.

Year 3 have started to learn how to partition 3 digit numbers in maths, and have started a new unit in English where they will writing their own adventure stories! They have also started to look at digital devices in ICT.

Year 4 have made a great start to the year. They've really enjoyed the start of their new book, Ice Palace, which has linked well to their Journey stories unit in English. In history they have started learning about The Romans, while in DT they have been designing Roman shields.

Year 5 have been inspired by the beautiful book, 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers, to write character descriptions. In maths they have been recapping their understanding of place value and learning about the power of 10. They have considered scientific enquiry methods in science and are eager to learn more about space.


Year 6 are learning important editing skills in English, through a story called 'Battle Bunny.' The story begins as a happy, mundane text about a bunny, that is edited into a riveting battle story, emphasizing the powers of good editing. In maths, they are continuing their unit on place value; focussing on ordering, comparing and rounding integers.
