## Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have continued learning about "Marvellous me". They have compared their baby photographs to themselves now and how they have changed over the years. They have enjoyed role playing the story of the "Three little pigs" and mapping out the story with actions. During maths sessions they have been learning about matching pairs. During phonics they have learnt the sounds o,c,k,u,b.

*Year 1* have enjoyed the story of Hansel and Gretel. They had great fun role playing the story and then drew story maps to retell the story. In maths they have been comparing numbers and groups of objects. In science they have labelled the different parts of the human body.

*Year 2* have been writing the story of Toby and the Great Fire of London. In maths they have been comparing numbers and recapping counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. In history the children have been thinking about past and present, comparing the differences between life in 1666 and the present day.

Year 3 have been writing their adventure stories this week in English, showing us their fabulous writing skills. In maths they have started looking at addition and subtraction. Finally, in science they have been looking at some fabulous fossils and how they are made.

Year 4 have ordering and comparing large numbers in maths, while in English they have started writing their own journey stories. In history, they imagined what it would be like to be a Roman Soldier based at Hadrian's Wall and wrote letters in character back to their Mothers in Rome! The children have also been enjoying dodgeball in PE.

Year 5 have been very busy this week, working in groups to innovate their own Eco-poetry. They have worked hard to include figurative language, repetition and alliteration to form powerful stanzas to inspire people to take care of the things they love on our planet. In maths, they have explored mental strategies of adding and subtracting large numbers. They found a good understanding of number bonds was very important to be successful. They have discovered how search engines work in computing and have tested how searching a clearly defined term compiles a better index of search results.



In ICT they have been learning how to make and move 3D objects on a programme called Tinkercad. It's been really fun!
