# Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have had a brilliant time "going on a bear hunt". They have been retelling the story in the playground and then have made their own version of the bear hunt story. In maths they have been learning about numbers 4 and 5 and the children have been practising subitising and sorting different representations of these numbers.

Year 1 have been continuing their work on subtraction. In science they have been thinking about how they can group different animals. After remembrance day on Friday, they have written sentences about the characters in the book 'Where the poppies now grow'.

Year 2 have been working really hard in maths, learning the column method to add 2 digit numbers. Remember to keep practising this at home! In English the children have been using their knowledge of conjunctions to write some sentences about the Great Fire of London. In art over the last few weeks they have tried really hard to draw St Paul's Cathedral using charcoal. Some very impressive drawings. Well done Year 2.

Year 3 have been creating an imaginary world in English and have started to learn writing techniques to describe that world. In maths they have moved on to learning the multiples of 4 and 8 while doing lots of investigations in science to find out how light can be affected by different things. In computing this week, they have made some awesome stop frame animations on the lpads!

Year 4 have been writing setting descriptions and working on their times tables. They have been really enjoying their netball and gymnastics lessons too! Owls class were very excited to share their class assembly with everyone, which included some of the French that they have enjoyed learning.

Year 5 have been planning their persuasive letters to Miss Hunter to make changes in school during their English lessons. In maths they have continued the unit on fractions and have been exploring adding fractions with different denominators. In history lessons the children have been learning all about crime and punishment since the Roman times.


