The gates are open between 8.35-8.45am, please ensure that you make every effort to send your child in through the gates rather than through reception as they are exceptionally busy first thing in the morning.

### The importance of punctuality

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As mentioned in our bulletin a couple of weeks ago, regular school attendance is an extremely important part of giving children the best possible start in life. Equally important is that all children arrive on time. The main gate opens at 8.35am and closes at 8.45am enabling you to drop off your child at any point within this time. If your child arrives after 8.45am then they will not be able to come into school via the main gate but should instead come in through the main office. Registers are completed at 8.50am and children arriving after this time are recorded as late and **from Monday will need to be signed in by their parent at the office**.

If your child arrives at school later than 9.20am we are required to mark them as absent for that half day session and it is classed as an unauthorised absence. If a child is regularly late for school, a parent will be expected to attend a meeting to look at how home punctuality can be improved.

Learning begins promptly at the start of the day and children miss vital learning if they are late to school. 10 minutes late each day equates to a 6 days learning lost a year. 30 minutes late each equates to 18 days lost a year. Please try to ensure your child arrives at school on time each day.

#### **Attendance**

Our minimum attendance target is 96.5%. Please help us to ensure your child receives the best education by attending school regularly and being on time.

Our whole school attendance for the week commencing 14th November 2022 was 92.7% which is unfortunately well below our target.

#### Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have been learning about hibernation. They have made cocoa powder playdough hedgehogs and have visited the reflective garden and have built hibernaculums. During maths they have looked at numbers 1 more and 1 less. During literacy they have written words and sentences using positional language.

Year 1 have been creating a fact file on Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot using the information we have learnt in our history lessons. In science we investigated different animal diets. We finished our addition and subtraction unit in maths and we are ready to move on to geometry next week.

Year 2 have been learning about the differences between a statement, command, question and exclamation mark. In maths we have been finishing column addition and are moving onto column subtraction. In science this week, we are thinking about recycling and what happens to materials once we have finished with them.

Year 3 have been creating our own stop frame animations in computing, working towards creating our own stone age themed animations. In maths we have been learning about multiples of 8 and 4. In english we have been writing setting descriptions for an imaginary world, using smiles, metaphors and alliteration! Finally in Design and Technology we have been thinking about how to create our own 3D models of Stonehenge!

Year 4 have begun their new unit on letter writing and continue to enjoy their class text, The Butterfly Lion. It maths, we have been working on our times tables, while in Geography we have been creating graphs with climate data. We've also really enjoyed sorting and classifying vertebrates in Science.

Year 5 have been continuing their learning about fractions in maths and have moved on to subtracting fractions from mixed numbers. In english we have started a narrative writing unit and have been creating a timeline of events for the video Titanium which will form the base of their writing next week. In history we have been looking at crime and punishment during the medieval era.



Dear Parents and Guardians,

#### **Holidays in Term-Time & Penalty Notices**

In line with the Department of Education's guidance with effect from the 1st January 2023 the Penalty Notice, which was put on hold during Covid will be reintroduced at Beechwood.

If you wish to take your child out of school during term time you have to request permission by completing a 'Request for Leave' form which is available from our website or the school office.

Holidays requests will only be authorised if:

- \* You make an application to the Head Teacher in advance and
  - \* There are exceptional circumstances

The Department of Education issued to schools that as of September 2013 holidays in term time should only be authorised if there are "exceptional" circumstances.

'The school Head Teacher will determine whether the circumstances are exceptional or not. Please note that there is no automatic right to take a holiday in term time. The Head Teacher will decide how many days your child can be away from school if leave is granted.

Should you feel that you have "exceptional" reasons for applying, please contact your child's school at the earliest opportunity and use the appropriate school form. Whilst the cost of a holiday might be an issue it is not considered to be sufficient to be an exceptional reason.

Please be aware that unauthorised holiday absence of 5 days or more can now result in the issuing of a Penalty Notice which carries a fine of £60 or if not paid after 21 days then the fine is doubled to £120 and court prosecution if unpaid after 28 days. Penalty Notices are served per parent, per child'.

#### **Penalty Notices**

Section 23 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003 empowers Local Education Authorities to issue Penalty Notices in cases of unauthorised absence from school.

The Education (Penalty Notices) England Regulations 2004 came into force on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2004.

This leaflet is sent to people who received Penalty Notices and is intended as a guide.

This legislation requires Local Education Authorities to create a Code of Conduct covering the use of Penalty Notices and a copy of this can be found on the Wokingham Schools Hub at:

The Penalty Notice must comply with the Code of Conduct. Prior to receiving a Penalty Notice you will have been sent a warning letter unless it is due to unauthorised holiday.

The law states that it will be presumed that you have received the Penalty Notice 2 days after it was posted to you.

#### **Payment Options**

Having received a Penalty Notice you have 3 options.

#### **OPTION 1**

Within 21 days of receipt of the Penalty Notice, pay £60 using the details in the Penalty Notice.

#### **OPTION 2**

Between 22 and 28 days after receipt of the Penalty Notice pay £120 using the details in the Penalty Notice.

#### **OPTION 3**

Do not pay the Penalty Notice. In such cases you will be automatically summoned to appear in Court for an offence under Section 444(1) Education Act 1996.

If you pay as per Options 1 or 2, then this discharges any and all liability on your behalf concerning the non-attendance of your child, for the period quoted in the Penalty Notice. This means that it will not result in you having to attend Court and you will not have a criminal conviction recorded against you.

However, if you cannot afford to pay the Penalty Notice or you feel that one of the statutory defences applies then, by choosing Option 3, you will have the opportunity to explain your situation to the Court. If you either plead guilty or you are found guilty, the Courts have a wider range of sentencing options, which could include a maximum fine of up to £2500.

The only statutory defences to the offence under Section 444(1) Education Act 1996 are:

- The child was absent for medical reasons
- ➤ The Local Education Authority failed to provide transport when required to do so
- > The absences were due to religious observance
- You had permission of the school or there was an unavoidable cause

#### WITHDRAWING A PENALTY NOTICE

The legislation governing Penalty Notices states that once a Penalty Notice has been issued, it can only be withdrawn if there is proof that:

- The Penalty Notice was issued to the wrong person
- The use of the Penalty Notice did not conform to the terms of the Protocol

If you believe that either applies to your case then you are asked to contact us in writing without delay in order that we can consider your representations. We must point out that the time period for payment does not stop whilst your representations are being considered.


