# **Ofsted Journey**

Dear Parents and Guardians,

It is hard to believe we are now less than two weeks away from the Christmas holidays, which will also mean we have done one third of another academic year.

Since Beechwood's last Ofsted Inspection, which took place in 2018 and before the school joined Frays Academy, much has been done to improve the school and the provision and outcomes for all pupils. As part of this we have improved and developed a number of aspects. These have included; improvements to teaching and learning, our curriculum, leadership, Early Years, SEND provision, assessment, marking and feedback, behaviour strategies as well as developing our vision 'Explore, Discover and Achieve'. We recognise the school written about in the 2018 Ofsted report does not reflect in any way the school Beechwood is today. We are confident that Ofsted will also recognise this when they carry out their next visit which we anticipate will be at some point this academic year.

Our whole school attendance for the week commencing 28th November 2022 was 91.7% which unfortunately again is very much below our target.

### Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have listened to the story "Paddington's Christmas Post". We have learnt about how the post office sorts and sends letters. We have made Christmas cards and drawn arctic animals. During maths sessions we have been looking at part and whole numbers and in literacy sessions we have written about arctic animals.

Year 1 have been writing letters to Father Christmas asking him to tell our class elves to behave! In maths we have started our shape unit and have compared 2D and 3D shapes. We have also been thinking about the differences between Woodley and Sydney and investigating seasons in geography.

Year 2 have been busy practising their nativity show, we can't wait to show you! We have also been writing a letter to Miss Hunter to tell her what we have learnt over the past few months about the Great Fire of London.

Year 3 have been investigating how shadows are made and how they change in science. In DT we have continued to make our 3D Stonehenge models. In maths we have been reviewing the skills we have learnt so far in year 3 and have created our own stop frame animation in computing.

Year 4 have been writing letters to a friend in english, while in reading we are coming to the end of the Butterfly Lion. In geography we have been comparing the UK to the African Savanna. In PE we have become excellent netball players and also produced some controlled performances in gymnastics.

Year 5 have had a brilliant week! We thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the Winchester Science Centre - we loved learning how to make aerodynamic rockets and the planetarium show was AMAZING! In maths, we have started recapping on the formal multiplication methods from Year 4 and challenging ourselves with reasoning and problem questions. We have been planning our adventure narratives in english, detailing how Stanley and Zero will escape Camp Green Lake.


