Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage's topic this term is 'We are Explorers'. On Friday we turned the hall into an airport and the children jetted off with their passports and teddies on 'Beechwood Airways'. After landing in Italy, the children have had a great time learning about the country this week. We have been learning to speak some Italian words and created mosaics and flags on the ipad. In literacy, we have made delicious pizza and written recipes. Our maths learning this week has been focusing on match the numerals to quantities with numbers 1-5.

Year 1 have explored the life of Queen Victoria in their topic lessons and completed some great writing about Victorian artefacts in english. In science we have started our unit on materials and the children had the opportunity to explore the different types of every day materials.

Year 2 have started their topic 'Carnival of the Animals', they were very excited to have the animals visit yesterday and enjoyed holding them as well as finding out about them. They are going to be using the facts they have learnt to write some fact files about the animals. In maths they have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes.

Year 3 have begun learning about the rainforest as their new topic, they have located rainforests on a map and have been writing information reports about them in english, getting facts from our book, Rainforests in 30 seconds. We have also been learning some painting techniques with help from a visiting artist! In P.E we have learnt about the footwork rule in netball and some balances in gymnastics.

Year 4 have been to our first swimming lesson at Palmer Park which we really enjoyed. In english, we have been writing adventure texts and we have also began our new class book - Sky Hawk. In science we have been making electrical circuits and we have also been fascinated to learn about aeroplane design in DT.

Year 5 have enjoyed learning about rivers and have been exploring techniques of comparative writing. In maths, we have been applying our multiplication skills to word problems and are now moving onto division. We have had fun in PE learning how to "Dance by Chance", a technique developed by dancer and choreographer Merce Cunningham where movements are generated by randomly selecting numbers.


Year 6 have been creating beautiful figurative sentences in english. We have used a poem called 'The Dreadful Menace' to build our own sentences, using personification, similes, metaphors, and more. In maths we have finished off fractions and started a unit on measurements.
