# Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have been visited by some firefighters and even got to go in their fire engine. They really enjoyed learning about all the equipment that the fire engine holds and had a go at squirting the water from the hose to put out a pretend fire. In maths they have been learning about doubling and in literacy they have acted out the story of The Gingerbread Man.

Year 1 have started their new topic - 'Around the World in 80 days.' The children made passports and tickets and travelled on the Eurostar to Paris. They have been learning about life in France and famous landmarks and will travel to different countries over this term. In maths the children were able to get out in the sunshine to practice their counting in 2s and they will also be counting in 5s and 10s this week.

Year 2 have started their new topic Castles and Catapults. In English they are using the story 'Tell Me a Dragon' to create their own dragons and write beautiful descriptions about them including similes. In maths the children are reviewing addition and subtraction .They have loved being scientists this week for Science Week, finding out which biscuit is the best for dunking. They had lots of fun!

Year 3 have begun their topic on ancient Greece, learning a song about Orpheus and Eurydice in music and reading a non-fiction text about ancient Greece in reading. In English the children have been looking at describing mythical creatures using some fantastic adjectives! Year 3 are looking forward to their ancient Greek workshop tomorrow.

Year 4 have started a new genre study in English: suspense writing. They have been creating their own superheroes and will be writing a story featuring their characters. In maths, they are continuing to learn about decimal numbers, moving from tenths onto hundredths. In science, they are carrying out experiments to find the best biscuit for dunking: does the temperature of the liquid make a difference? In history, the children have started work on the Vikings, with the time period going up to 1066. In P.E. they are going to be looking at Rounders and outdoor and adventurous activities. Both their P.E. sessions will (hopefully) be outside this term.

Year 5 have started their unit on shape in maths. They have been classifying and estimating angles. In English, the children are exploring features of a recount and writing techniques they can use within them. They enjoyed their first lesson of Outdoor Adventurous Activities in PE, where they had to work as a team and develop their communication and negotiation skill to achieve tasks.


Year 6 have started their new topic, "Your mountain is waiting". The children are currently reading their class text: Everest, which focuses on the lives of Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay. In English they are using descriptive writing to convey emotions and atmosphere of Danny MacAskill, who is, bravely and skilfully, biking through the Cuillin Mountains on the Isle of Skye.
